

Set Up

Assemble the rod sections together making sure they are secure and flush. Insert the rod into the banner binding.

Ensure that the tip rod is inserted all the way to the end of the binding.

Hook the elastic over the base hooks. To adjust the tension (too tight or too loose) adjust the elastic and cleat.



N.B Teardrop & Vertical Banner base & rod versions.

Attach the banner to the spindle ensuring the collar on the base is UP.

Place the base rod over the spindle and push the collar DOWN to lock it into place.

Finn / Sail / Surf Banners

Rod does not have this collar.

Please reverse the above steps - unlocking the collar - when removing the pole from the base.



General Care

- ✓ Always ensure that the tip rod is all the way to the very end of the binding of the banner. (this will avoid the possible piercing of the binding fabric)



- ✓ Ensure the rods are securely fitted together
- ✓ Adjust the tension of the banner regularly, by adjusting the elastics at the base
- ✓ As the banner rotates 360 degrees make sure the banner has enough clearance to avoid rubbing on walls, plants etc
- ✓ When you are using a ground stake ensure there are no obstacles such as rocks, concrete and pipes etc.
- ✓ Take care when putting in the ground stake, avoid hitting the spindle
- ✓ When erecting the banner make sure it is clear of all electrical wires when at full height
- ✓ Rinse with warm soapy water on a regular basis and dry thoroughly before packing away
- ✓ To increase the life span of your banner take down at night or in winds exceeding 25 knots & store indoors

General Life of Banner

The lifespan of your banner will vary greatly dependant upon usage pattern. The more it is exposed to the elements, the shorter the lifespan.

With normal use and attention to care, you can expect your banner to last approximately 12 months, possibly longer before the need to order replacement skins, which, is an affordable way to update your message.
